

Changing Windows Internet Explorer Title

By default, the system adds "**Windows Internet Explorer**" to the end of the IE title bar after the name of the current Web site; however, you can modify this behavior.

Start your registry editor (e.g., **regedit.exe**), and navigate to:
"**HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Software\Microsoft\Internet Explorer\Main**" subkey.

From the Edit menu, select New, **String value**.
Type a new value name of "**Window Title**" and press Enter.
Double-click the new value, type the title you'd like to appear in place of the IE title (e.g., "**IE provided by N-cg.net**"), and click OK.
Close regedit.exe.

The change takes effect immediately.
